




One day a goat, a dog and a sheep got into a taxi. They were going to visit their families on the farm.




The goat was very drunk. He drank spirits from a small bottle all the time.

The sheep got nervous because he was in the middle.




When they got to the place the taxi driver said, "The fare is 50c each."

The dog gave the taxi driver R1.




The goat opened the door, fell out of the taxi and ran away.
